<u>Infant Day</u>

Until Friday 6th September, the Junior Infants will go home at 12.30 p.m. From Monday 10th September, the Junior Infant Day ends at 2.00 p.m. Senior Infants will go home at 3.00 p.m. Thank you to all our Junior Infant parents this year for their prompt pick ups at 2.00 p.m. It has made a huge difference to the other children in the room and I know that their Senior Infants will benefit greatly from that extra hour of attention next year.

Book Money

Thank you to everyone who has already paid their book money. It would be much appreciated if all book money was paid before the end of term. We have tried very hard this year to ensure that the book rental costs have not increased. Thank you also to the children who have taken such good care of their books this year.

Volunteers

We were fortunate to have many volunteers in the past year who gave of their time to help with activities in school. In particular, I would like to thank Charlene Perry for her regular help in school.

I would also like to thank Mrs Esther Russell for her help with R.E. in the Senior Room and also for the many other activities she has supported us with in school this year.

For the new school year, we are again looking for people who would like to help. In particular, those who would like to do some reading activities/craft work/cooking etc. would be very welcome.

As mentioned at the End of Year Show, the school no longer receives a maintenance grant for the school grounds or building. This grant (which amounted to approximately 40% of our budget) was abolished by the government last year. Thank you to all those who helped with maintenance issues this year and those who responded when we needed urgent help. I would particularly like to thank Alan Mahon for his help in locating and solving our water leak.

<u>Uniform</u>

Please ensure the children have <u>navy trousers or skirts</u> and <u>black shoes</u> to wear with their burgundy jumpers. Thank you for your support of this during the year.

On P.E. days, the children should wear their navy P.E. sweatshirts and plain navy tracksuit bottoms (**no stripes or logos please**).

<u>Please make sure all uniform items are clearly labelled</u>. There are several jumpers and sweatshirts at school which have not been claimed by anyone.

We are also asking that, for Health and Safety reasons, jewellery is not worn at school. (Exceptions to this rule are tasteful stud earrings and wristwatches).

Attendance/Absences

The average attendance in school this year was 97%. Your help in ensuring that appointments etc. are arranged outside of school hours when possible and bringing children into school before and after appointments is much appreciated.

If a child is not coming to school, please ring or send a note with a sibling. It is school policy to contact parents if we have an unexplained absence.

Please note that parents are legally obliged to provide a written explanation for children's absences.

As Principal, I have a legal obligation to report all children who are absent for more than 20 days in a school year and also those children whose attendance is erratic or giving the school cause for concern, whether they have missed 20 days or not.

Education Cuts

You may be aware that the Special Needs Budget has been reduced yet again in the last few days. <u>Children allocated Resource Teaching Hours have now had their hours cut by 25%</u> in the past few years. This impacts not only on those children receiving Resource Hours but also on the rest of the children as their own class teachers have to try to make up for this reduction in teaching time as well as meet the needs of all the other children in their classes.

Restructuring the provision of Special Needs teachers in schools may mean that next year, Mrs McMahon will be unable to continue in her current role. We hope that this is not the case and look forward to seeing her return in September.

Head Lice

We have had very few outbreaks of head lice this year and we would love to keep it that way so can I please ask that every child is checked and treated over the holidays? The chemists have a range of shampoos that will successfully clear up any infestation.

<u>Please do not send your child to school if you suspect they may have head lice and</u> <u>please bear in mind that it is very frustrating for everyone if untreated heads are re-</u> <u>infecting other children on a regular basis.</u>
